2. Outcomes of the joint Local Strategic Partnerships Board meeting of 11 May (Ruth Goldstone)

At a joint meeting of *Adur in Partnership* and *Worthing Together* Local Strategic Partnerships on 11 May, it was decided to bring the two bodies together to form a Local Strategic Partnership (LSP) for Adur and Worthing. As a result of this, the Children & Young People Forum of Worthing Together and the Children & Young People Forum of Adur in Partnership now form a single body. It should be possible to present a structure

diagram for the new LSP before long. New terms of reference will need to be agreed for the newly merged Children & Young People sub-group of the LSP.

3. Waves ahead – getting on with it (Ruth Goldstone / Dick Bryant)

At the LSP Meeting of 11 May, priorities were identified that could lead to quick wins in delivery of *waves ahead*. Subsequently, Ruth extracted from these the potentially quick wins relevant to children and young people. They stretched across the four strands of *waves ahead*:

- Better place to live, work and enjoy
- Better health and wellbeing for all
- Learning, training and employment opportunities for all
- Safer communities

Ruth explained that the task before members now was to select three or four of the priorities that the CYP partnership could work with to achieve quick wins, bearing in mind that no new funding or personnel would be available; the idea was that partnership working could provide what was needed.

Dick Bryant then presented as an example, something that he was already working on which, with partnership working, could result in a quick win.
